The Jamaica Bay Kayak Tournament was May 16<sup>th</sup>. It was a great tournament with lots of fish caught. There were bass, bluefish, sea robins, and some large weakfish caught.

For a fishing report, 30lb bass are being caught on pencil poppers and live bunker in Deal. Breezy Point has bass feeding on rain fish (perfect for a flyrod) or you can use ½ oz bucktail. Boaters who troll can use shad rigs-all are working to catch the bass. There are short fluke all

over the bay right now, Robby seemed to find some keepers in Atl. Highlands Harbor. Bluefish and fluke up in Keyport. There was a 15lb bass caught at the entrance to Great Kills Harbor. Dolphins are back in the rivers again.

The Veterans went up to the Pequest Hatchery and there were 40-50 large trout caught.

The outing this month will be at Sandy Hook. Either North Beach or horseshoe cove depending on the wind direction. That is Wednesday June 24<sup>th</sup>.
